

The Wright Brothers

When you hear a plane fly overhead, it may not seem like a big deal, but just over 100 years ago, airplanes were a novel idea. Wilbur Wright was born on April 16, 1867. On August 19, 1871, his little brother Orville Wright was born. The pair paved the way for human flight. When the two boys were young, their father brought home a toy "helicopter" for Orville and Wilbur. The foot-long toy was made of paper, bamboo, cork, and a rubber band. When the toy broke, Wilbur and Orville built their own. Building the toy interested them in flight.

The two boys opened a bicycle shop in 1892, but still remained interested in aviation. They began creating kites based on paper, wood, and two kinds of string material. The Wright Brothers began testing their theories about flight with kites. Finally, the brothers traveled from Ohio to Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, where they could find a period for testing their new glider. On December 17, 1903, Orville piloted the Wright Flyer to the world's first controlled, powered human flight. Orville and Wilbur Wright proved that humans could fly in airplanes!




